

My visit to Point Nepean National Park



We are going to the Quarantine Station in Point Nepean. Point Nepean is a National Park which is a place where plants and animals are cared for. The Quarantine Station is an old place with lots of old buildings.



When I arrive at the park, we will park in the carpark. I need to stay close to my adult to stay safe. I need to watch out for moving cars.



The signs will tell me where I need to go.



There are cars and cyclists on the roads and paths here. I need to be careful near the road. I must stay with my adult when crossing the road.



I can ride my bike or scooter on the path. I will share this path with other people.



At the Quarantine Station there is an Information Centre.
In the Information Centre I can find out more about the history of the park. I can get a map of the park. I can get an activity sheet here.
There are Customer Service Officers who can answer my questions.



I can go into 4 of the buildings. A banner out the front mean that I can go inside. The buildings are old and may be loud and echo when I am inside. I can go outside with my adult or use ear plugs to block out the sound.



Inside the buildings there is old equipment. I can touch them with my hands only. I can walk through the tunnel in the disinfecting building.



There are toilets that I can use. I can also use the accessible toilet. If I need to go to the toilet, I ask my adult first. There are electric hand driers which can be loud when they are used. I can use ear plugs or ear muffs to block out the sound.



There are people who work at Point Nepean. They are called Park Rangers. They wear a uniform. I can ask them questions about the park.



There is a beach I can go to. There is a ramp so I can access the beach safely. I need to ask my adult if I can go near the water. When I am near the water I need to stay near my adult.



There are tables in the park we can sit at. There are BBQs we can cook on. Our food stays with us. Animals have their own food to eat. We will need to take our rubbish home with us or use the bins provided.



I had fun at the Quarantine Station in Point Nepean.
